### Just following directions... a few words on planned giving.

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, Julie Ross and I attended a diocesan planned giving workshop on behalf of St. John's (Julie is serving as the vestry member for stewardship this year). Planned giving is a major emphasis for the church right now as we seek ways to ensure that there are sufficient resources for future mission and ministry in central and eastern Kentucky. As one of the presenters noted, the instructions for planned giving in the Book of Common Prayer come at a time when we might not expect them. Rather than being listed among the instructions for ministering to the sick and dying, the instructions above come from a section entitled "Thanksgiving for a Child." We are instructed to talk about wills and providing for the future at the same time we celebrate new life. This is as it should be.

In the months to come, the vestry will be working with these resources from the diocese and the Episcopal Church Foundation to fine tune our endowment and gift policies. In addition, through our partnership with the ECF, St. John's will be able to offer greater resources for people interested in planned giving. In short, the ECF allows smaller congregations like ours to take advantage of a wide range of options comparable to the "development" arm of major universities and large non-profits. As someone under 40, I am particularly encouraged by the wholistic vision of ECF: planned giving options are available for people of all ages and economic circumstances. And that was a major emphasis of the presenter: planned giving is not about the size of the gift, but the love and dedication with which it is given.

More to come as we continue working on plans to sustain St. John's and grow our capacity for another 170+ years of ministry!

Dear St. John's Episcopal Church:

The Kentucky Heritage Council is pleased to inform you the Ready-Twyman House was entered in the National Register of Historic Places on March 7, 2019.

The National Register of Historic Places is the official list of properties recognized by the federal government as worthy of preservation for their local, state, or national significance in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering or culture. It is also the story of our nation and has been referred to as a "roll call of the tangible reminders of the history of the United States, a list of distinction identifying for the public those properties worthy of preservation for their historic value." It is, therefore, a pleasure for the Kentucky Heritage Council to participate in this program and make our nation aware of Kentucky's rich cultural heritage.

Benefits include limited protection against adverse action by federal agencies and eligibility for federal and state tax benefits for the rehabilitation of depreciable historic buildings. Listing in the National Register also makes you eligible to purchase a certificate of listing, suitable for framing. The Heritage Council charges a nominal fee of \$10.00 for a certificate, to pay for production and postage. If you wish to purchase a certificate, please mail a check payable to

Kentucky State Treasurer, to our office. The Kentucky Heritage Council encourages owners of historic properties to display National Register certificates or plaques as a means of recognizing and promoting the National Register program to visitors and future owners.
